PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Let's Work Hand-in-hand for Building Safety

The verdict of the Coroner's Court on the death inquest of four casualties during the incident of building collapse at 45J Ma Tau Wai Road happened last year once again aroused great public concern about the safety of aged buildings. Whilst the devastating tragedy has shattered the confidence of the general public in the robustness of the structure of high rise buildings, the inadequate care and dilapidated conditions of them have rung the alarm bell. The sad incident is also a painful lesson for all building professionals that we have an important duty to ensure the safety of buildings in Hong Kong. We must point out that Building Surveyors are well-trained for building surveys and inspections. They are competent and qualified professionals to identify signs of distress and assess the condition of building in accordance with their experiences and professional judgment.

In the past many years, Building Surveyors have been contributing tremendous and unfailing efforts to ensure the proper maintenance and safety of buildings including government properties, private properties and public housing in Hong Kong. As rightly illustrated by our

Building Surveying Division Chairman Mr Vincent Ho during an interview with RTHK on 20 August 2011, Building Surveyor is like a general practice doctor who is professionally trained to be responsible for the first-line diagnosis of a patient's sickness accordingly to his/her symptoms. Building Surveyor is capable of making judgment of when to refer the patient to a specialist surgeon for further treatment.

With due respect to the verdict of the Coroner's Court, we would emphasize the significance of the owner's responsibility in maintaining the safety of their properties. Perhaps, it is the time for some owners to surrender the practice of "leaving all works to the Government". No matter how much resources are put into the removal of dangerous and unauthorized structures by the Government, the present situation will not be improved unless the owners take their own responsibilities on building maintenance. A comprehensive review to the existing mechanism in the Government is urgently required to expedite and simplify the legal enforcement actions to compel the irresponsible owners to perform

their duties timely and diligently. In parallel, we should also actively promote the idea of proper building maintenance through escalated education and publicity activities to change the indifferent mindsets of some property owners. Apart from relying on the resources of the Buildings Department alone, the Government should consider joining the efforts with the Home Affairs Department and Fire Services Department to provide necessary assistance in helping the owners to better manage their properties.

Besides building safety, I would like to report on some key activities of the Institute in the past months.

A number of informal gatherings were organized by the Strategic Planning Committee for our Office Bearers to meet some of our past presidents, past GC members, valued senior members and young members. The aim was to strengthen communication, listen to their needs and aspirations and tap their brains on strategic issues. The meetings turned out to be very fruitful with enthusiastic participation of members. Members shared their views on the current development of the Institute and proposed many useful ideas and suggestions on how to enhance public image, professionalism and leadership of the Institute. Senior Vice President Serena Lau will continue to follow up with the proposals in the Strategic Planning Committee.

Albert Cheung Hau Wai, Chairman of the Mainland Affairs Committee, paid a recent visit to Beijing and met surveyors there. It was well attended and the linkage was now built. There is a growing need to strengthen our communication and services to all surveyors working in China, including those who have awarded MHKIS status through our reciprocal recognition. Albert is reviewing our situation in the China market and will recommend a strategy for consideration by the General

Council. Furthermore, representatives of Development Bureau and our Divisional delegates will jointly visit to Beijing early November 2011 with a view to enhancing our communication with our counterparts in China. They will also take this opportunity to explore if there is any possible further collaboration under CEPA.

Seven fellow members and I recently attended the PAQS conference at Sri Lanka and the theme this year is "Cost Management in a world emerging from adversity". QSs in the Pacific region are doing well and they have a strong cohesion in promoting their services to other countries in the region. Keynote speeches were excellent and major threats facing the QS profession were vigorously analyzed. Many high standard and enlightening papers were presented including "life cycle based assessment tool for sustainable construction", "a new chapter of green buildings in Hong Kong" and "a review of cost planning methodology adopted in managing engineering projects". I look forward to seeing more publication of research papers by our fellow surveying professionals of Hong Kong in future.

To meet the new challenges coming to us every day, I would like to share with you a saying by Sir Winston Churchill:-

"To improve is to change; to be perfect is to change often."

Let us have the wisdom, power and courage to keep changing for a better to-morrow.

會長的話 RESIDENT'S MESSAGE

各方攜手合作 確保樓宇安全

去年馬頭圍道 45J 塌樓事故導致 4 人死亡的死因裁判,再一次喚起公眾對舊樓安全的關注。這次慘劇不僅削弱了公眾對高樓大廈結構穩固性的信心,還為日久失修的樓宇響起了警號。專業建築業從業員必需從慘痛事件中汲取教訓,並肩負確保香港樓宇安全的責任。我們必須重申,建築測量師在樓宇勘察及檢測上訓練有素,具備專業資格,並有能力憑藉樓宇表徵評估樓宇狀況。

多年以來,建築測量師一直以來致力於適當樓宇維修,以確保香港各類樓宇(包括政府物業、私人樓宇、公共屋邨大廈)的安全。正如本會建築測量組主席何鉅業先生接受港台訪問時所言,建築測量師就好像一個受過專業培訓的普通科醫生,透過檢查病人的病徵,作出初步診斷,並有能力決定何時轉介病人至專科醫生。

我們尊重死因庭裁決的同時,我們亦必須強調業主在維持其物業安全上的重要性。也許,有些業主需要改變一貫依賴政府的做法。除非業主肩負起樓宇維修的應有責任,否則無論政府投放多少資源清拆危險及潛建物,情況亦將不會得到改善。我們認為政府需要急切檢視現行機制,簡化司法程序,提升對業主的阻嚇力,使業主遵守法令,依時進行適當維修。與此同時,我們亦需要透過加強教育及宣傳,積極提倡大廈保養及維修,從而改變某些業主根深蒂固的觀念。除了屋宇署外,政府亦應該考慮聯合民政事務處及消防處的資源,共同提供支援,提升業主管理物業的能力。

除了樓宇安全的訊息之外,我也想藉此機會匯報過去數 月學會的幾個主要活動。

策略計劃委員會籌辦了數個非正式聚會,讓執行理事與歷任會長、歷任理事會成員、資深會員和年青會員進行交流。會面旨在加強溝通、聆聽會員的需要、期望及對會務策略的想法。會員在聚會中反應熱烈,積極分享對本會現時發展的想法,並為提升本會形象、專業化和領導提出了很多具建設性的建議。這次活動在輕鬆的氣氛下取得豐碩的成果。高級副會長劉詩韻測量師將會在策略計劃委員會繼續跟進聚會上的有關提議。

最近,內地事務委員會主席張孝威測量師造訪北京,與當地測量師會面,並在當地建立了聯繫網絡。我們期望與於中國內地工作的測量師(包括在互認下取得會員資格的會員)加強交流,並提升對他們的服務。張孝威測量師正探討測量師在內地市場的情況,並將草擬有關策略建議予理事會考慮。另外,本會組別代表亦將與發展局於2011年11月到北京交流,期望進一步加強與內地行業機關的溝通。同時,他們亦會藉此機會進一步探討在更緊密經貿關係安排(CEPA)上的合作。

最近,我與7名會員出席了於斯里蘭卡的 PAQS 會議。今年的主題是「在逆境世界中的成本控制」。在太平洋地區的工料測量師團結一致,致力於地區內向其他國家宣傳其專業服務。主題演説十分精彩,精闢地分析了工料測量專業所面對的主要威脅。會上發表的報告及論文均極具質素,題目包括「以生命周期為基礎以評估永續建築的工具」、「香港綠色建築新一頁」、「管理工程項目的成本計劃方法回顧」。我期望日後會有更多香港專業測量師出版的論文。

我們每天也迎接新挑戰。因此,我希望以邱吉爾爵士的 名句與彼互相勉勵:-

「改變才會帶來進步;時常改變才會至臻完美。」

讓我們有智慧、力量和勇氣,為更美好的明天不斷更新 求變。 ■■

The Committee held its meetings on 17 May, 27 June and 8 August 2011. The current updates from Divisions on their reciprocity arrangement were noted. Members of the Committee also met Mr David Tong, Mr Ricky Li and Mr K K Chong of the Development Bureau on 13 June 2011 to raise concerns and difficulties regarding the registration mechanism on the Mainland. The Committee is planning to arrange a visit to Beijing later in 2011 to explore collaboration with other mainland counterparts for LS, PD, and PFM disciplines.

The committee has held 3 meetings to date, respectively on 17 February, 13 May and 19 August, 2011. Some of the issues being discussed are as follows:

1. A Secondary School Promotion Working Group to enhance the promotion of Surveying Profession to the

secondary school students has been recommended and set up. The Convenor of the working group, Mr Raymond Kam and representatives had submitted two proposals which are under consideration. Meanwhile, promotion through alumni's experience sharing appears to be an effective way to attract young talents. In this regards, members are invited to assist WG to contact your secondary schools.

- 2. Currently there are six working groups under the coordination of the Committee. They are: Constitutional Development, Heritage, Tree Management, Urban Renewal Strategy Review, West Kowloon Cultural District, and Secondary School Promotion. Working Group for Urban Renewal Strategy Review has completed its works. Sincere thanks for the Working Group and its convenor, Mr Tony Tse. Committee has discussed any potential topics which should be addressed in the latest meeting.
- 3. The committee is on progress to update the corporate video. Committee considers the current version can be enhanced to cope with the promotion purpose for the next few years. Besides, YSG is designated to recommend means to increase HKIS exposure along with the new media technology being introduced.



Working Group on Urban Renewal Strategy Review

The Working Group was set up in May 2010 to advise the General Council the standpoint of HKIS on the Urban Renewal Strategy Review. The Working Group held meetings on 25 May and 9 June 2010 to study and discuss views of the Institute on the subject, then came up with a position paper which had been submitted to the Legislative Council for its special meeting of "Review of the Urban Renewal Strategy - Stage 3 Public Engagement" held on 10 July 2010. On behalf of the Institute, I had attended the said meeting. Our submission could be found in HKIS website. Ms Serena

Lau, the then Vice President, had also attended the special meeting of the Panel on Development of the Legislative Council held on 20 November 2010 and reiterated our standpoint.

The Working Group also held meeting on 15 August 2011. It is the general understanding of members of the Working Group that the duty assigned to the Working Group has been fully discharged.

Working Group on Secondary School Promotion

The Convenor of the working group, Mr Raymond Kam and representatives from all the Divisions and YSG is tasked to promote Surveying Profession to the secondary students. A PR proposal 小測量師眼中的「項目」was proposed, however this has been postponed due to the tight schedule.

The Working Group is then requested to explore other possible promotional activities to secondary school students. Another proposal will be submitted to the PSAC for review once it is ready.

Finance Committee

In the first half of this year, the Finance Committee had reviewed the annual subscriptions and application fees for admission into HKIS membership. A discussion forum was organised for members to express their views. The EGM was held on 25 March 2011 and the resolution was passed for adjusting the fees mainly according to the changes in inflation.

In order to gain better income from the money deposited in bank, the Finance Committee had obtained the approval

of the General Council for HKIS to open more accounts in several reliable banks so as to make it more flexible for HKIS to choose the bank which offers higher interest rate at the prevailing time. We are also exploring ways to increase income from our funds in a prudent manner.

The Committee is now working on the review of the charges for placing advertisement in HKIS publications and the web site. The rental charges of the Surveyors Learning Centre are also under review.

Mainland Affairs Committee

Chairman: Mr Cheung Hau-wai

In the first half year of 2011 Mainland Affairs Committee (MAC) conducted and participated in a number of activities to maintain HKIS' presence and service to HKIS members in the mainland.

On 6 May 2011, Mr Edwin Tsang, a member of the MAC, took part in leading a HKIS delegation to visit HKIS members working in Guangzhou. The Delegation exchanged views on professional development in Hong Kong and Guangzhou.

From 27 to 30 May 2011, Mr Cheung Hau Wai, the Chairman of MAC, co-organized and took part in a HKIS delegation attending the 2011 Ministry of City and Rural Construction and Hong Kong Construction Forum.

The Main theme of the Forum this year was on preservation and revitalization of historical buildings. The delegation set up a booth illustrating HKIS professional work and presented at the forum a building preservation project in Hong Kong.

On 1 July 2011, the Chairman of MAC visited members of the HKIS Beijing Forum. A total of 15 members of the forum attended the gathering. The Chairman briefed the forum the latest development in Hong Kong, including building revitalization, the Hong Kong Beam Plus, a Hong Kong green building labeling system, opportunities for HKIS members to become Beam Professionals and Beam Assessors, and the work of the Construction Industry Council. Members of the Beijing Forum expressed their wish that a closer ties in terms of professional development, qualification curriculum and counterpart professional bodies should be established between HKIS and the mainland.

Mr Cheung also took the opportunity to attend the GIO NIC 2011 Conference co-organized by the Tsinghua University and the University of Reading. The conference focused and exchanged views on Chinese Construction overseas, international construction business, construction industry governance and transparency, response to disaster, construction site safety.



Research Committee

The Research Committee was formed to initiate and devise research projects for General Council's consideration. The Committee vetted research proposals from Divisions and recommended to the Executive Committee for formal approval.

The Committee also organized the "Outstanding Final Year Dissertation Awards" for final year students of the HKIS accredited first degree courses and the "Dissertation/ Thesis Awards" for postgraduate students. The Awards for 2011 are being organized. Dissertations/theses nominated by respective universities would be assessed by nominated assessors. Results would be announced in December 2011.

Working Group on HKIS Office Premises

Chairman: Mr Tony Tse

Since the formation of HKIS in 1984, its Office Premises have been leased and located in core Central District. The current lease at Jardine House will expire in early 2013.

For forward planning, the Administration Committee in 2010 directed that a Working Group, with one representative from each Division and Young Surveyors Group, be formed to study and report on the future of HKIS Office Premises including its location, size and whether the Institute should purchase its own premises.

The first meeting of the Working Group was held on 30 July 2010 and a total of six meetings have been held up to July 2011.

With the agreement of the General Council, the Working Group conducted an open survey in April 2011 to seek an understanding of members' views and preferences on whether the Institute should continue to have its Office Premises located in core Central District and also whether the HKIS should consider acquiring its own premises.

Two open discussion forums were also organised to solicit and encourage members to express their views and opinions. The first discussion forum was held on 29 March 2011 prior to the dispatch of the questionnaire survey, and the second was held on 18 May 2011 before the deadline for return of the questionnaire.

All valid returns of the questionnaires received by the deadline were analyzed and discussed by the Working Group. A report summarizing the findings of the survey together with key observations and recommendations of the Working Group have been submitted to the General Council in early August 2011 for their further study and consideration of the way forward.

Land (Compulsory Sale for Redevelopment) Ordinance (LCSRO)

Pilot Mediation Scheme Run by Joint Mediation Helpline Office (JMHO)

The Land (Compulsory Sale for Redevelopment) Ordinance (Cap. 545) (the Ordinance) came into operation in 1999. The Government, by publication of the Land (Compulsory Sale for Redevelopment) (Specification of Lower Percentage) Notice in the Gazette in January 2010, specified that with effect from April 1, 2010, in respect of three classes of land lot, the application threshold for compulsory sale would be lowered from 90% to 80%. Under the Ordinance, any person who owns not less than 80% of the undivided shares in a lot may make an application to the Lands Tribunal for an order for the compulsory sale of all of the undivided shares in the lot for the purposes of redevelopment.

In order to assist owners involved in or contemplating applications for compulsory sale for redevelopment, the Development Bureau provides financial support to the Pilot Mediation Scheme (the Pilot Scheme) to facilitate the owners to undertake mediation on a voluntary basis. The Pilot Scheme is independently administered by the Joint Mediation Helpline Office Limited. The Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors has been being one of the eight Participating Service Providers (PSP) of the JMHO, since July 2010.

The aim of the Pilot Scheme is to mediate dispute or difference between owners arising out of or in relation to applications for compulsory sale of land lot that has been made or is intended to be submitted to the Lands Tribunal.

After completing the training and briefing on Cap. 545 Land (Compulsory Sale for Redevelopment) Ordinance arranged by JMHO, accredited mediators from the eight PSPs will be informed and invited for joining the List of Mediators in 1.4 f above for the Pilot Mediation Scheme.

Costs and Fees

The Pilot Scheme is independently administered by the JMHO with venue support provided by the Hong Kong Housing Society. To assist users, a uniform application fee and rate of mediator fee is charged for mediation under the Pilot Scheme.

2.	Mediator fee (shared equally by parties) - Pre-mediation session (up to 3 hours) - Subsequent mediation session (from 4th hour to 15 hour)	HK\$3,000 per hour HK\$3,000 per hour

For mediation under the Pilot Scheme, the mediator fee for the first 15 hours, which are at fixed rates, are paid in equal shares by the owners, save for eligible elderly minority owners.

Eligible elderly minority owners who have paid the application fee and satisfied the means test may receive the mediation service free of charge under the Pilot Scheme. The share of the mediator fee of the pre-mediation session (up

to 3 hours) and the first 12 hours of the mediation session(s) will be paid by the Government upon successful application to the JMHO.

Express of Interest for Mediation Training Organized by the Institute

Mediation, a form of alternative dispute resolution, is increasingly being used by organizations, courts and governments as a more satisfying and effective means of resolving conflicts between parties. To equip members with an understanding of mediation and the skills needed to serve as a neutral third party mediator or represent clients in mediations and to become an accredited mediator, the HKIS is in the course of organizing a Mediation Training Course. The organization of such course would be dependent on the response from members.

The 40-hour Mediation Training Course is expected to be conducted in late 2011 and will also include simulations and assessments.

Members who satisfactorily complete the 40-hour training course and assessments, and subject to meeting the admission criteria, can apply for admission to the Panel of Mediators of the Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors and Hong Kong Institute of Architects (Joint Panel of Mediators). A member of the Joint Panel of Mediators can also be eligible to participate in the mediation cases referred by the Joint Mediation Helpline Office Ltd to HKIS.

註冊專業測量師 (Registered Professional Surveyors, 縮寫 RPS),是根據《測量師註冊條例》(第417章),在測量師註冊管理局旗下註冊的專業人士。註冊專業測量師一共分為六個組別,其組別名稱和英文名銜縮寫為:

● 建築測量 Building Surveying RPS(BS)

● 產業測量 General Practice RPS(GP)

● 土地測量 Land Surveying RPS(LS)

● 規劃及發展 Planning and Development RPS(PD)

● 物業設施管理 Property and Facility Management RPS(PFM)

● 工料測量 Quantity Surveying RPS(QS)

測量師註冊管理局負責監管註冊專業測量師,以保障公眾對測量服務的要求。 註冊專業測量師代表了:

- 高水平的專業能力;
- 擁有足夠和有關的本地經驗;
- 高準則的專業誠信。

概括而言,註冊專業測量師不單符合專業資格,而且富有經驗和熟悉本地執業 運作,能提供最好的專業意見和服務。

Damon is a Partner with the Projects (Engineering and Construction) Group of the international law firm Hogan Lovells. He initially qualified as a Chartered Civil and Structural Engineer and is a Member of the Hong Kong Institution of Engineers. Since he subsequently also qualified as a solicitor, Damon has undertaken a wide range of both contentious and non-contentious construction related legal work. In particular, he has handled a large number of construction related litigation and arbitration proceedings involving extensive expert input over the years. He is a Fellow of the Hong Kong Institute of Arbitrators and the

Chartered Institute of Arbitrators and acts as an arbitrator.

The long-standing immunity from suit enjoyed by experts in legal proceedings has been abolished by the UK Supreme Court on 30 March 2011 in its recent decision in the case of Jones v Kaney. In light of this and other important recent legal authorities (UK) on conflict of interest and independence of experts, it is perhaps time to revisit the duties of an expert witness. The speaker will discuss the expert's role in relation to legal proceedings in light of the recent developments and authorities and look into the Supreme Court's reasoning for abolishing the expert's immunity from suit. This should be an area of major interest and concern to surveyors who act as or intend to become expert witnesses and/or have to deal with experts in or as a result of any legal proceedings.

Chairman's Message



Summer recession used to mean a period of release and refresh after a year's hard work in my school time. Hard luck, it appears building surveyors do not have this privilege to take a short break in this year.

The sad collapse accident of 45J Ma Tau Wai Road has sparked off a hot discussion on building maintenance problem and the control of unauthorized building works since early 2010. We have repeatedly advised the government and the public the appropriate way to deal with the existing building problems. Still, it requires concerted actions from legislation, enforcement and public education. BSD has put a great effort in advising the government in pushing forward the minor works control system and the Mandatory Building Inspections Scheme (MBIS) in one end while on the other end, spent tremendous effort in educating the public on the importance of building maintenance and the risk and liability of building owners in these respects. Our building safety voluntary inspection service provided to owners of the old buildings last year has contributed to this aim successfully. However, it has yet to see the results as it would take time to reverse the passive mind set of the owners. It is still a long way to go for the society as well as for us, building surveyors! 雖前路漫漫,但任重道遠。

The recent Coroner's Court judgment and comments on this tragedy has effectively served a serious warning to the building profession in particular, we, building surveyors. With due respect, I could not personally agree with all of the comments and recommendations of the Court due to the presence of a lot of unanswered doubts of the case transpired in the expert reports and opinions regarding the causes of collapse of the building. However, the Court did bring out an important message that we should equip with adequate professional knowledge and experience in conducting building surveying and related safety assessment. Consistent approach, procedure, methods and assessment criteria would be critical to facilitate us to make a correct and reliable professional judgment.

In the past few weeks, I have persistently explained and clarified to the public, media and LegCo members our professional practice and approach in conducting building inspections and building safety assessment in order to obviate the misunderstandings and misjudgments on our professional competence. At the same time, we have to catch time to consolidate and update a set of practice guide on building inspections. I trust the working group set up early this year will work hard to make it ready the soonest possible.

The term "visual inspection" seems being misunderstood by the Coroner's Court and the public. We held a technical seminar to the media on 26 August 2011 to explain and clarify the real professional approach and functions of this surveying method. We grasped this opportunity to support the view that there was no practical need to require initial inspection of every complaint / emergency case received by BD by "twin professionals". I have presented the same message to the media and the public through various radio programs, TV interviews and newspaper reports.



LegCo Subcommittee meeting on 26 August on Building Safety & Related Issues

A LegCo subcommittee meeting on Building Safety & Related Issues was held on 26 August 2011 to follow up the judgment and recommendations of the Coroner's Court on the tragedy of the Ma Tau Wai Road building collapse case. In response to the judgment and other comments raised, BSD has issued a press release and submitted a statement letter to the LegCo to present our views on the subject.

香港測量師學會就馬頭圍道 45J 的樓宇倒塌事件的回應

死因裁判法庭於 2011 年 8 月 16 日就四名人士在 2010 年 1 月在馬頭閩道 45J 的樓字倒塌事件(下稱「該事件」)中死亡的原因作出裁決,再次引起大眾對樓字安全的關注。香港測量師學會(下稱「學會」)一直以來重視本港樓字安全、致力推動社會對樓字安全的關注。提升大眾對樓字安全及 維修保養的意識。對於不幸事件的發生、學會感到難過。惟期望在各方的 通力合作下,避免不幸事件再次發生。

學會尊重死因裁判法庭就該事件作出的裁決,包括對個別屋宇測量師作出的意見及評論。學會藉此機會重申,專業建築測量師均是接受過嚴格而有系統的專業訓練,通過專業評核及考試,才能取得專業資格。而樓宇安全勘察及評估是其中重要的一環,建築測量師是有能力對樓宇安全狀況作出專業的評估,並因應實際情況建議進一步的行動。

「目測」是一般樓字勘察中的必須方法及首要程序,學會亦肯定「目測」 的作用。在測量專業界內,「目測」只是泛指以非破壞性方法進行的勘察 方式。測量節透過此方法勘察,初步判斷樓字的狀況,並就是否需要作進 一步詳細檢查提出意見。在大多數情況之下,一些有問題的樓字可以透過 其表面跡象觀察得到。同時,亦可透過定期的勘察,監察樓字狀況的變化。 當然,專業測量節在有需要的時候,會輔以其他測量工具及醫材,確認 發結果及確定樓字的狀況。在進行樓字勘察前,亦會做足準備工夫,如翻 查樓字的批准圖則和改變用途的記錄等,以了解樓字的整體狀況,包括建 築方式、批准用途、間隔設計、窗戶採光、通風、排污排水設計、防火建 築、逃生救援過道、防水防滲設計、外牆飾面設計用料、其他外掛構件、 水紅及機房設計、必須的屋字設施、結構設計形式等。若發現樓字狀況出 現異常問題,測量節會連同其他專業人士作進一步詳細的檢測,或轉介其 他專業人士跟進。

BSD has put forward a proposal to formulate a total development project management system for this development which would allow and facilitate joint-hand of BSs and 內地監理工程師 in providing professional project management services. As agreed in the meeting, a cooperation agreement will be prepared for this corporation between HKIS and 深圳建設監理協會. I believe it would be an important breakthrough of BS profession in future practice in the mainland.

Talk for Kowloon City Building Maintenance and Repair Workshop

I represented BSD to deliver a talk on building maintenance and repair for the Building Maintenance and Management Workshop organized by Kowloon City District Council on 20 August 2011.

Free consultation service for Hong Kong Housing Society

On 19 August 2011, on behalf of BSD, Nathan Lee and I received a group of building owners and provided advice and opinion in how to handle problems encountered in the repair and improvement works projects at the HKHS Yau Ma Tei Centre.

Draft Code of Practice on MBIS/MWIS

Amidst the hot discussion on building safety, BD has just issued a draft Code of Practice on MBIS/MWIS on 26 August

2011 in the web site. It is with regret that the draft code still fails to respond or address to most of our comments made in the past two years. Notwithstanding, I still invite members to take close study on the draft code in order to prepare for the implementation of the schemes. You may also furnish any comments or queries on the draft to me for my feedback to BD accordingly.

Revision courses for the APC 2011

We continued to have a series of revision courses for the APC 2011 in August and three topics, "Structural consideration on A&A works", "Review of MOE Code" and "Basic building services design considerations" have been delivered. The last two topics, namely "Building/ Lease/ Planning Control" and "Contract Administration" which are very often questions picked out by assessors at the practical task and the final professional interview, will be held on 2 and 20 September respectively. Probationers should not miss these two revision courses. Besides, a mock assessment workshop for Practice Task has been confirmed to be conducted in the weekend of 24 and 25 September at Wu Kwai Sha Youth Village. Candidates applying Practice Task this year are highly recommended to join this workshop and at the soonest ask the HKIS office for any vacancy available.



GP Surveyors under CEPA

After a meeting with the Development Bureau (DEVB) on CEPA affairs which HKIS GPD (and others) raised issues on difficulties that GP Surveyors faced with when practicing in Mainland, a HKIS delegation which will be led by the President will visit officials in Beijing on 2-4 November 2011. GPD has prepared a wish list of discussion items. Main items to be submitted to the concerned authority are:

Reciprocity of Professional Qualification – Since HKIS
has already obtained reciprocity arrangement with the
CIREA, we now wish to achieve similar arrangements
with the other two counterparts - China Appraisal
Society and China Real Estate Valuers Association.





Meanwhile, HKIS would have a meeting with officials of The Liaison Office of the Central People's Government(中聯辦) and solicit their assistance and coordination for this visit.

The New APC

As reported earlier, the GPD APC structure is undergoing reforms in line with the recent amendments of the HKIS Constitution & Bye-Laws. APC leading to professional membership consists of two parts. Part One takes the form of written tests whereas Part Two remains as an interview assessment. Candidates may take Part One after one year training and if they pass Part One, they may proceed to Part Two upon completion of two years' training.

In Part Two, candidates, before the interview, are required to submit a critical analysis of two cases, one of which must be a valuation case. Candidates may choose any one case for presentation.

Cognate degree holders and Non-cognate degree holders take a different path at the initial stage. Non-cognate degree holders will have to attend a mandatory structured learning programme ("the Programme"), upon completion they can take the same path as the cognate degree holders. Cognate degree holders are encouraged to attend the Programme although this is not mandatory. Details of the new APC will be announced in due course. It is expected that Part One of the new APC will start to run in 2013.

Members will be kept informed of the progress on the APC review.

Nanjing Technical Visit (late July)

During the tour, delegates had the opportunity to visit the Planning/Development Exhibition Gallery, seminar with officials in the Housing and City/Rural Deveopment Bureau and discussion with the management staff of South-east University.

Land Surveying Division Chairman's Message

Hong Kong Professional Land Surveying Service in Qianhai Cooperation Zone (前海深港現代服務業合作區管理局), Shenzhen, Mainland

The Ordinance of Shenzhen Special Economic Zone on Qianhai Shenzhen-Hongkong Modern Service Industry Cooperation Zone (Qianhai Cooperation Zone) was recently approved at the ninth meeting of the standing committee of the Fifth Shenzhen Municipal People's Congress.

Under the Ordinance, the Authority of Qianhai Shenzhen-Hong Kong Modern Service Industry Cooperation Zone of Shenzhen (the Qianhai Authority) will be established and given the authority to exercise the power of examining and approving non-financial projects enjoyed by cities with separate planning status. On 4 Aug 2011, we met delegates from Shenzhen Nanshan Science and Technology Institute (深圳市南山科技事務所) which is appointed by the Qianhai Authority to discuss:

- The intention of surveyors in working and developing at Qianhai Cooperation Zone;
- 2) The difficulties and obstacles of surveying profession in developing at Qianhai Cooperation Zone;
- 3) The type of support required from the Qianhai Authority if surveyors work in Qianhai Cooperation Zone.

We had a fruitful discussion on how professional land surveyors in Hong Kong could provide our professional service in Qianhai under the current Surveying and Mapping Law of the People's Republic of China and other regulations.

Follow-up discussions and site visits will be held in the near future. I shall keep you updated on the latest development.

Ordinance for determination of land boundaries and establishment of Cadastre system

An effective land boundary system supports sound land governance of Hong Kong by enabling an identification of the extent of land parcels with certainty. It is of utmost importance to know the exact boundaries of the property as it protects the rights and interests of the property owners.

We support the Government's enactment of legislation for determination of land boundaries, in order to administer the leased and un-leased land, control land use and formulate policies for planning and land development. It is essential for the Government to carry out its duties with certainty of land boundaries.

The provision should best be incorporated in the Land Survey Ordinance (Cap 473) such that the standard and control of relevant professional are already in place.

We also urge the Government to consider establishing a cadastre system in Hong Kong to facilitate the public and other professionals to access relevant land boundary information. The cadastre is a record of land right supplementing the current land registration system in Hong Kong. There are various ways in which details about the land may be recorded, reflecting the diversed ways in which land can be viewed. Broadly speaking there have been two approaches: one focusing on its legal aspects and the other on its fiscal or resource potential. The former, called land registration or the land book system, concentrates on the abstract rights associated with the land. The latter is the cadastre and often contains more evidence about the physical size and shape of areas, and data on land values or land use.

A key element in the cadastre is the cadastral map or plan. They serve one of two purposes – to locate areas of land and to provide information about each area. They may provide details about a single parcel of land in support of a land book entry; or they may show all the parcels within a given area and thus act as an index to help identify each one of them relative to the others.



Introducing HKIS to potential land surveyors

HKIS was invited by the Hong Kong Polytechnic University to give a brief introduction of HKIS and the student membership to the LSGI Orientation Programme.

The talk was held on Friday, 26 August 2011 and aided by our corporate video with a short powerpoint. The students were interested to learn that Professional Surveyors in Hong Kong are supported by various ordinance, namely the Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors Ordinance (Cap 1148), the Surveyor Registration Ordinance (Cap 417) and the Land Surveyor Ordinance (Cap 473).

Surveyors' Work in Visual Inspection to Buildings – TVB News Interview

I was interviewed by TVB News on 10 August 2011 to give some description about surveyors' work in carrying out visual inspection to buildings. I hope that my explanation can help the public to understand more about our work thus enhancing our status in the society.

P&D Surveyors are working hard on and contributing on the sustainable development of the community.





Opportunities for Surveyors in Development of Qianhai, Shenzhen

Representatives of the Institute (including the Senior Vice President together with Council Members from the Building Surveying Division and Quantity Surveying Division) as well as the Hong Kong Institute of Architects are invited by the Development Bureau for meeting with a delegation from the Bureau of Housing and Construction of Shenzhen Municipality (深圳市住房和建設局) held at Murray Building on 16 August 2011. The delegation consisted of more than ten members, which was led by the Vice Director of the Municipality, Mr Duan. Their study missions for the visit to Hong Kong included the following:

- Understanding of the professional service provided and professional practice of Architects, Building Surveyors and Quantity Surveyors for the projects in and outside Hong Kong;
- 2. Operation of the professional/consultants firms;
- 3. Organization and operation of HKIS;
- 4. Statutory requirements and private practice of project management;
- 5. Co-operation and Implementation of mutual recognition of professional qualification;
- 6. Difficulties found in professional practice in Guangdong Province and Shenzhen;
- 7. Difficulties found in establishment of professional firms, including registration for appropriate qualification in Mainland:
- 8. Proposal for professional service provided for the Development of Qianhai, Shenzhen; and
- 9. Development of green buildings in Hong Kong.

The meeting started with some PowerPoint presentation for the project development by the Government of HKSAR by representatives of Development Bureau and followed by discussion/Q&A sessions.

The delegation visited HKIS on the second day. After watching the promotion video of the Institute at our Board

Room, the President with the Chairman and Vice Chairman of BSD and QSD had a meeting with them. The chief delegate, Mr Duan, introduced the proposed development of Qianhai, Shenzhen, which included the pilot scheme for introducing financial, insurance, logistic, information technology and professional services from Hong Kong and overseas in this 15 Ha development. Professionals from Hong Kong may set up their firms there with some stringent qualification requirements exempted. The delegation was briefed with the differences in management and control of the professional firms between the Mainland and Hong Kong.

Another meeting for in depth discussions for further cooperation between the professional firms at Shenzhen and Hong Kong with the Authority of Qianhai Shenzhen-Hongkong Modern Service Industry Cooperation Zone of Shenzhen Administration of Qianhai Bay Bonded Port of Shenzhen has been arranged in early September 2011 in Shenzhen.



Raising Quantity Surveyors' Profile and Status, Singapore and Hong Kong

The President and five QSD Council Members met the three representatives from the Building and Construction Authority

(BCA) of Singapore at our offices on 29 August 2011. They are Mr William Tan, Director, Ms Ng Siew Kuan, Deputy Director and Ms Karen Tan, Senior Executive Development Officer of the Business Development Division. The purpose of the visit is to find out a more effective way to raise the profile of the Quantity Surveying profession and also to attract adequate quality graduates to join the QS profession.

Subsequent to the brief introduction of each individual participant, Mr Tan told us the registration system of Architects and Engineers, but there is no such a requirement for Quantity Surveyors in Singapore. It is quite often in Singapore that general public will approach the Architect instead of the Surveyors in the first place for proposed development, redevelopment and renovation works. In Singapore, youngsters who enrol surveying courses in the university are diminishing in number, which in turn, there are less people entering the Profession. It was raised in the discussion that career prospect, social status, job satisfaction and wages are key elements for attracting the young generation in the surveying courses of the universities and entering the Profession.

Career opportunities in the Government of HKSAR, such as Architectural Services Department and Housing Department, are exclusive for candidates with Quantity Surveying professional qualification, which is different from Singapore. It is very important to have the Government's recognition in order to help promoting the image of Quantity Surveyors.

Secondary School visits and career talks by the Institute/QSD are very useful and effective for introducing the surveying profession to the youngsters and the public.

10 August 2011 – How to Prepare for an appeal against a decision of the Building Authority by Mr Cheung Kwok Kit

Thank Mr K K Cheung, partner of Litigation and Dispute Resolution Group, Deacons Hong Kong, for giving us an insightful seminar about the preparation for an appeal against a decision of the Building Authority. The seminar attracted more than 170 members to attend.

The seminar began with an introduction of the power conferred by the Building Authority under the Building Ordinances and how the Building Authority exercises the

discretionary power. The introduction was then followed by a detailed explanation on the procedures and practical tips, such as the time frame and essential materials for preparing an appeal against a decision of the Building Authority.

At the end of the seminar, Mr Cheung shared some relevant court cases with us and also covered the new Buildings Department Enforcement Policy against Unauthorized Building Works (UBW) that was published in April 2011.





16 August 2011 - An Overview of Disputes relating to Old Lease Clause by Mr Lawrence Pang

Owing to the different periods of the land grant, the terms and conditions of the leases are not only different in nature, the wordings being used might also be quite different although they sometimes have similar meaning. The CPD was full house that evening. During this CPD, Mr Lawrence

16 August 2011 -Site Visit to HATS2A - Construction of Sewage Conveyance System from North Point to Stonecutters Island (Contract No. DC/2007/23)

The project comprises of the construction of a network of vertical shaft and sewage tunnels to collect sewage from preliminary treatment works at northern and south-western part of Hong Kong Island. The collected sewage is conveyed to the Stonecutters Island Sewage Treatment Works via a total of 21km deep tunnels with depth up to 160m below sea level. Before the site tour,

Mr CF Chan and Ms Edith Sia from Gammon Construction Limited and AECOM delivered a very detailed presentation to our members about the background and the objective of this project and the associated construction methods like the drill and blast method, etc. Then, we were guided to visit the shaft excavation and ELS construction. It was an excellent opportunity to our members to learn and understand more about this world-class civil project. Thank Mr CF Chan and Ms Edith Sia.

Visit to Kerry Parkside, Shanghai

Districts in the New Territories

There are now Nine (9) Districts in the New Territories, namely Yuen Long, Tuen Mun, Tai Po, North, Shatin, Tsuen Wan, Kwai Tsing, Sai Kung and Islands. They are in line with the District Offices of the Home Affairs Department

which were established after a series of administrative regionalization. The diagram below depicts a historical account of the changes since 1899.

Surveyors in Hong Kong concern most not the District Offices but the District Lands Offices and the District Survey Offices run by the Lands Department. So there were nine District Lands Offices as well as nine District Survey Offices in line with the District Offices. However Tsuen Wan and Kwai Tsing were amalgamated in 2004. So at present we have only eight (8) District Lands Offices as well as eight (8) District Survey Offices in the New Territories. They are Yuen Long, Tuen Mun, Tai Po, North, Shatin, Tsuen Wan & Kwai Tsing, Sai Kung and Islands.

Lands Department also runs two District Lands Offices in Hong Kong Island and two District Lands Offices in Kowloon. So the Department currently has twelve (8+4) District Lands Offices.

The above change is a prerequisite for a surveyor who digs past documents in the New Territories. For example one may find some old land records in Shatin which were deposited in the Land Office, Tai Po because once Shatin was part of Tai Po.

Property Investment - Road to Become Rich?

In recent years, the real estate market has been booming to such a high point that makes return from property investment extremely appealing. This leads to a general belief in the public that real estate business is the most profitable industry and that the property developers are the ones that benefit most from it. But is it true that investing in real estate is the easiest route to become rich?

Due to rapid population growth, high inflation, favorable economic condition and other social factors, Hong Kong property prices have risen considerably over the past three decades. However, it is my personal opinion that investment in real estate does not necessarily guarantee profit-making, the result could vary significantly due to the choice of different timing and type of property.

Upon analyzing the data from the Rating and Valuation Department, it is noted that the category of property that achieved the highest price increment over the period from 1980 to 2010 is not residential, but the core Grade A office space. Whilst property price, particularly the large-scale private housing estate has increased by about nine times, price of core Grade A office space has appreciated stunningly beyond eleven times.

Successful Investment counts on choice of purchases with the right timing

As for investment on ground floor shops, choices such as the Canton Road at Tsim Sha Tsui or Russell Street at Causeway Bay may top your investment to much higher than ten or even more than hundred times! However, for industrial premises, data shows that the gain is only about five times in the last three decades, which may be even less than investing on a blue chip stock. Such return could even be down to merely three times if not for the government "revitalizing industrial buildings" policy introduced not too long ago. Thus, return on different choices of type of property can differ drastically.

Substantial increase in property prices can be very rewarding. Yet the market fluctuates dramatically over the past 30 years and investment in real estate is not always a "sure win"! Compare to the peak in 1997, residential property prices in 2003 have been down by more than 60%, a huge loss to property owners, whether developers or individual investors. So if acquiring a property in 1997 and sold it during the year

2003, you could end up with a huge debt! There have been cases like even as solid as banks did not survive the financial turmoil. Like all other investments, real estate market is also subjected to financial risks and market fluctuations. Since choices of property type and timing are crucial, how could one master the right timing and choice to invest? The key, I believe lies in a thorough understanding of government policies.

Government Policies - The Key to Good Results

As Hong Kong's largest landowner and property supplier, HK government also is the authority to determine and implement land and housing policies. Thus, her every move would have different degree of impact on the real estate market. In the 80's, the "fifty hectares" limited the annual land supply. In the early 90's, the policies to combat property speculation, such as the increase of stamp duty, restriction on the sales of uncompleted properties and the famous "85,000 housing flats" policy in 1997, all imposed direct impacts on the rise and fall of property prices. Since 2003, the government has changed her land sale policy by introducing the "Land Sales Application List" system, which effectively allows the developers to have "large say" on the amount of new land supply. The reduction of new supply, the cessation of HOS, the relaxed policy on sales of uncompleted properties etc. are some of the main reasons to the drastic increase of property price in the last few years.

To conclude, no matter it is the private individuals or the property developers, a thorough understanding of government policies is the key to success in real estate investment. Developers have much resource in hiring experts to analyze and recommend strategies, so their investment odds are naturally higher than the general public.

讀「地產霸權」後感 (二)

自從寫下讀「地產霸權」後感後,我覺得始終不能迴避究竟 香港有沒有地產霸權這一論點,故此我今次嘗試深入淺出深 討這個問題。

我們就由什麼是地產霸權開始吧,請容許我再次引用潘慧嫻女士在「地產霸權」一書中引邱吉爾在 1909 年的演説(見第 190-192 頁)「壟斷土地的地主無須作任何努力或貢獻」,請注意地主一詞,雖然書中沒有給予一個定義,但英國的土地大部份是 freehold 的,即永久擁有(沒有年期和用途的限制:it is a perpetual monopoly and it is the mother of all other forms of monopoly, page171, Land and The Ruling Class in HK),freehold 是源自封建制度,即類似中國歷史中皇帝對諸侯封邑,是明証言順的地主。由 freeholder 批租給其他人士使用他/她們的土地叫 leasehold,租約給予承租人對該土地有清楚列明年期和使用權的限制,租約完後,一切得歸回 freeholder 地主。明白上列制度,我們可以看看我們現今處身香港的情況。

基本法第七條(註一)訂明「香港特別行政區境內的土地和 自然資源屬國家所有」,這有什麼特別意義呢?這要返回中 華人民共和國憲法來看了。

中華人民共和國憲法第一章總綱第十條(註二)説明「城市的土地屬於國家所有。……」又第九條「礦藏,水流,森林,山岭,草原,荒地,灘涂等自然資源,都屬於國家所有,即全民所有」,這樣看來,基本法第七條中的「國家所有」的意義是指香港特別行政區境內的土地是全民所有。又第十條説明「任何組織或者個人不得侵占,轉讓土地或者以其他形式非法買賣。土地的使用權可依照法律的規定轉讓。」同理香港房產的買賣其實是使用權的轉讓,即是香港特別行政區按基本法第七條批出的使用權,而並非土地本身的買賣。使用權其實就是 leasehold 的特色了。

故此,我想藉此説明潘慧嫻女士所指的個人地主,不可能在香港發生,因為香港土地擁有者在九七前是英女皇,九七後卻是全民。使用者的身份只一個租客,又怎能成為土地霸主(除租霸外?),極其量,他只能把握和發揮他在租約期內由外在因素所產生的機遇,如遇上物業市道週期性的蓬勃加速興建樓宇套現而以。

無疑,香港地產商經歷了七、八、九十年代經濟騰飛的日子,累積了不少財富,以至將盈餘投資在其他領域,如買下航空,港口,油公司,超級市場和公用事業等等,但將此說成霸權甚或至升呢入統治階層,實有抬高他們的感覺。

再者,作者列舉地產商買公用事業時,其實是看準它們的土地,這也是事實,美孚新村和海怡半島前身是油庫而太古城前身則是船塢等。但政府近來批出的巴士廠已改為短期租約

形式,這意味著新批的公用事業地盤不再以長約批出而改為 短期租約。約滿再績,故此地產商能經此途徑換地建屋的機 會已越來越小了。

政府最近已推出競爭法的咨詢,我對此認識不深,故此不便提出意見,政府確實著手處理歷史遺留下來的問題。而從賣地,換地補價的收益持續膨脹,卻是不爭的事實,就以過去一年政府的收入為例,可見一班。全年總稅收為 2090 億(不計賣地,補地價收入),正直與地產有關的印花稅為507 億(其中包括股票),物業稅為 16.47 億,利得稅中的931.86 億元中與地產有關的就無從得知,但從賣地和換地的收入卻有680億,因為全年開支遠低於稅收加收入,故此每位十八歲(雖然不是全民)市民可分得6,000元,其實派錢正正因土地升值回饋社會。誰是霸主,又或者根本沒有霸主,一目了然,看來明年或者也有盈餘,怎樣才是最好的使用,這還要好好的討論一下吧!

能凝聚一些共識,使盈餘更有效地運用就是寫這篇文章的額 外收獲了!


